

FULBRIGHT GRANTS

for Graduate Study in the United States

Academic Year 2005-06

Grants are available for graduate study at American universities for master's, doctoral or non-degree programs starting in the fall of 2005 for the full 2005-06 academic year. Grantees will receive cash awards of SEK 25,000 - 200,000 from the Fulbright Commission and will be eligible for additional financial aid from American universities.

The Fulbright Commission will apply for admission and for supplementary financial assistance at the grantees' preferred American universities. Awards from institutions in the United States vary in amount, depending upon a grantee's qualifications and field of study, and there is no guarantee that every grantee will succeed in winning additional financial aid nor that all costs for the academic year will be covered.

Eligibility requirements:

- Excellent academic record
- Swedish university degree completed by the summer of 2005
- Fluency in English
- Swedish citizenship

Applications will be accepted in all fields except medicine (with the exception of public health), dentistry, and veterinary medicine. Students who are already enrolled in a graduate program at an American university are not eligible. Persons desiring or holding permanent residence in the United States, as well as persons with dual citizenship (Swedish and U.S.), are ineligible for a Fulbright grant.

Preference will be given to candidates who have not recently studied for an extended period of time at an American university.

Application procedure:

The application packet has detailed instructions and forms. The application as well as three confidential letters of reference must be received by the deadline date of August 23. A small group of finalists will be interviewed in Stockholm during mid-September. Selected grantees will be required to take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) and, depending on the field of study, either the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) or the Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT). Grantees in law only need to take the TOEFL. The tests will be paid by the Fulbright Commission.

Application information:

For an application packet, send a self-addressed C4-envelope with SEK 11 in stamps, marked SGSP, to the Fulbright Commission. Electronic applications can be requested by e-mail, fulbright@fulbright.se, and for further information call the Commission between 8:00 - 12:00, 14:00 - 16:30.

Applications must be received no later than August 23, 2004. Applications received after August 23 will not be accepted. Preliminary notification of awards will be made by the end of September.
